Welcome to Hayes Meadow Primary School. We are a one form entry Primary school with a purpose built Nursery providing education for pupils aged 2 – 11 years.

We have a purpose built nursery for 2-3 year olds and a preschool for 3-4 year olds from the term after their third birthday.

We aim to provide our pupils with a broad range of learning experiences that will excite and inspire them in a caring and secure environment. Our motto is 'Be the Best We Can Be' and we ensure pupils develop a variety of skills to achieve their aspirations.



Hayes Meadow is situated on beautiful school grounds and we believe in providing learning



opportunities for our pupils both inside and outside of the classroom. Our pupils enjoy exploring in our Forest School area, encouraging independence and building self- esteem.

Hayes Meadow is a strong community and we have close relationships with our parents/ carers. Our pupils are involved in a variety of events in the local community including sporting events with our local cluster of schools.

Our Values

Nursery and Preschool Hours

Our school gates open at 8.45am. Pupils are able to come straight into school at this time to prepare themselves for the start of the day.

Nursery (2 and 3 year olds) -

15 hours - 9.00am - 12.00pm

12pm - 3.00pm

9.00am - 3.00pm all day

Preschool from the term after their third birthday (3 and 4 year olds)-

15 hours - 9.00am - 12.00pm or 12.00pm - 3.00pm

30 hours - 9.00am - 3pm

Please see the Mrs Morgan or Mrs Sivieri if you would like to use your child's funded hours in a different way.

Wraparound Provision

Breakfast Club

Breakfast Club runs Monday to Friday 7.30 till 8.45am. This costs £3 per morning and breakfast is provided with a choice of cereals, toast and squash. The Breakfast Club is available for our Nursery and Preschool children as long as they are registered in our Nursery or Preschool. This is only available by booking in advance and if our staffing allows for that day

2 year old provision

We accept children from the age of two through a paid placement or 'Think2'. Parents may be eligible for funding through 'think2' please scan the QR code to find out more. Paid placements are £4.50 per hour or £13.50 per morning or per afternoon. The children will be able to bring a packed lunch from home or have a school meal at an additional cost of £2.41 per day.

3 and 4 year old provision

From the term after their third birthday until they start school in reception, all children are entitled to 15 hours of free early years provision during term time. You may be eligible for an additional 15 hours, known as '30 hours'. To find out whether you are eligible for 30 hours childcare please scan the QR code which will provide more information for you.

If you are not eligible for these extra hours, we are able to offer paid additional hours, known as childcare, which can also be booked through the school office and paid for directly by parents/carers, this will be available for you at a cost of £4.50 per hour. The children will be able to bring a packed lunch from home or have a school meal at an additional cost of £2.41 per day.

After School Club

Hayes Meadow After School Club runs till 6pm every day in our school hall. The children will be able to have a snack, fruit and drinks if they wish. A variety of activities will be available for the children to access.

This is only available by booking in advance. This costs £3.50 per hour or £9.00 for a full session until 6pm. A booking form must be completed on the Monday of each week. This is to ensure we have the correct staffing ratios for your children and it remains

flexible for parents who may work shifts. Regrettably we are unable to take two year olds.

Pupil Behaviour

Hayes Meadow has a strong behaviour policy and a well established ethos of positive behaviour which is recognised by parents, pupils and staff and is commented on regularly by visitors to our school. We work hard to ensure that our pupils understand the importance of good behaviour, self discipline, self control and respect for others and property, All the staff work together to ensure a consistent, positive approach to behaviour. Celebrations

The children start school each day on the sunshine in the classroom. They could move to the Golden Star during the day for super listening, behaviour or good work.

Our children are rewarded with Team Points and stickers. There are four different teams and each week in our celebration assembly they find out which team has gained the most points that week.

Head Teacher's awards are presented in our Celebration Assembly each Friday to reward excellent learner attitudes and work.

Nursery and Preschool Class Teachers also present a certificate for 'Star of the Week!' along with a special



teddy bear who the children then take home to share in activities and events throughout the week.

Learning



At Hayes Meadow Primary School we believe that the school curriculum should be broad and balanced, offering children the opportunity to achieve success in many different areas.

The knowledge based curriculum that we teach in Nursery, Preschool and Reception meets the requirements set out in the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum. Our



curriculum planning focuses on the Characteristics of Learning, Development Matters and Early Learning Goals expectations.



The curriculum also promotes pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural development and supports the children in developing principles for distinguishing between right and wrong. Pupils are encouraged to think creatively and critically and to respect others and the environments in which they live.

We believe that the curriculum should stimulate enjoyment of and commitment to learning as a means of encouraging the best possible progress and the

highest attainment for all pupils, preparing them effectively for the next steps in their education.



The curriculum is made up of seven areas of learning and development, three prime areas (communication and language, physical development and personal, social and emotional development) and four specific areas (Literacy, Mathematics, understanding the world and expressive arts and design). In nursery there is a large emphasis on developing the prime areas through a high quality play curriculum and provision based on children's needs and interests.

There is a balance between child initiated and adult led activities as well as daily phonics, mathematics and literacy sessions to support children's key learning and development.

At Hayes Meadow we also believe in the importance of learning outside and children have access to a range of different experiences, resources and activities in the nursery and preschool outdoor area.

We know that from our experience children and indeed adults learn in different ways. When planning and supporting our children at Hayes Meadow we think it is important to consider the different ways children learn and reflect this in how we teach, organise our learning environment and support individual children and groups of children. Within the Statutory framework for the Early Years Foundation Stage they identify three "Characteristics of Effective Teaching and Learning"; these characteristics encompass children from birth to the end of the reception year and children will demonstrate them in different ways depending on the developmental level of the child.

Characteristics of Effective Teaching and Learning

Characteristics of Effective Teaching and Learning
Playing and Exploring <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Realise that their actions have an effect on the world, so they want to keep repeating them. Plan and think ahead about how they will explore or play with objects. Guide their own thinking and actions by referring to visual aids or by talking to themselves while playing. For example, a child doing a jigsaw might whisper under their breath: "Where does that one go? - I need to find the big horse next." Make independent choices.

Characteristics of Effective Teaching and Learning
Active Learning <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Participate in routines, such as going to their cot or mat when they want to sleep. Begin to predict sequences because they know routines. For example, they may anticipate lunch when they see the table being set, or get their coat when the door to the outdoor area opens. Show goal-directed behaviour. For example, babies may pull themselves up by using the edges of a low table to reach for a toy on top of the table. Toddlers might turn a storage box upside down so they can stand on it and reach up for an object.

Characteristics of Effective Teaching and Learning
Creating and Thinking Critically <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Take part in simple pretend play. For example, they might use an object like a brush to pretend to brush their hair, or 'drink' from a pretend cup. Sort materials. For example, at tidy-up time, children know how to put different construction materials in separate baskets. Review their progress as they try to achieve a goal and check how well they are doing. Solve real problems: for example, to share nine strawberries between three friends, they might put one in front of each.



Partnership with Parents

We aim to work in partnership with parents and carers and value the support of parents in helping us to improve the learning of pupils.

We hold a variety of parent information sessions including workshops where parents are provided with information to support their child with their learning.



There are also enrichment opportunities where parents can come into school and work with their child on a project or activity.



Newsletters, consultation evenings and special assemblies also help to support the work with our parents. Curriculum planners are available on school website for parents to see what the children are learning in school each term. Parents' views are very important to us and we encourage parents to provide feedback for us whenever possible.

Attendance

At Hayes Meadow we are continually striving to promote good attendance. We regularly review our attendance and reward children with good attendance.

Illness/ Medical Appointments

- If your child is absent from school we would ask you to inform the school office before 9.25am stating the reason for your child's absence and how long you expect your child to be off school.
- If your child is going to be late into school due to a medical appointment, please telephone the office so that the appropriate code can be assigned to your child's absence.
- If you have not informed the office of the reason your child is absent by 9.25am, you will be contacted asking you to explain their absence. If there is no reason provided your child will be given an 'unauthorised' absence mark in the register.

Requests for Leave of Absence

- Please note that all absence due to holidays taken in term time will be recorded as unauthorised.
- Absence can only be authorised in exceptional circumstances.
- If you are intending on taking your child out of school during term time we ask that you state clearly the reasons and the dates that this will take place over.

We monitor closely the nature of the events that the absence is being requested, the frequency of such events, the efforts made by parents to seek authorisation in advance and to plan ahead to minimise disruption to their child's programme of education. If authorisation is not sought or notification provided in advance the absence will be recorded as unauthorised and may result in a referral for a Penalty Notice from the Local Support Team.

Snack Time



Nursery and Preschool children are able to purchase toast at school for 20p each day.

All Nursery children are also able to have free school milk. The children are able to bring plastic water bottles into school and there is a designated place for them to keep them in the classroom. Please only provide water in these bottles and

ensure that your child's name is clearly labelled on the bottle.

Lunchtime



Pupils in Nursery and Preschool who are staying all day may purchase a school meal at the cost of £2.41 per day. Nursery children eat their lunch in the Nursery classroom with their teachers. Preschool children eat their lunch in the school hall.

There is a good selection of food each day and a choice of meal options including a cold choice of a sandwich or wrap.

Your child can bring sandwiches if they wish. If your child is bringing a packed lunch to school please ensure that their name is written clearly on the outside of their lunchbox. Lunch time drinks should be kept inside their lunchbox and be different from the water bottle kept inside the classroom. Please do not provide glass bottles or jars or any nut based products as we are a nut free school.

You can choose on a daily basis whether your child is having a school meal or sandwiches - they just need to tell their teacher in the morning. A meal planner is sent home each term informing you of the choices for the next terms meals.

School Uniform

Preschool 3 and 4 year olds.

We would encourage children to begin to wear our school uniform to help with the transition to Reception and to encourage a sense of belonging and pride in their school.

- grey skirts, trousers, shorts or pinafore dress
- pale blue or white polo shirts, shirts or blouses
- blue and white gingham dress
- royal blue fleece, jumper or cardigan
- black shoes

Parents/ Carers are now able to purchase our school uniform at the following places:

- Unbranded uniform can be purchased from any supermarket.
- Second-hand nearly-new uniform can be purchased from the school office.

Nursery 2 and 3 year olds

We would encourage all of our nursery pupils to wear a blue sweater and black jogging bottoms or leggings so that they feel part of our Hayes Meadow community but are able to move freely and feel comfortable.

- pale blue or white t-shirts or polo shirts
- black jogging bottoms or leggings
- royal blue fleece, jumper or cardigan
- black shoes, trainers

We ask that all children in our Nursery and Preschool have a pair of named wellingtons in school so they can access our wonderful outside areas in all weathers. Children will also need to have a clearly named coat and where possible waterproof suit.



Spares

We are aware that children will have accidents from time to time so we kindly ask that children bring named spare clothes in their bag daily. If your child is in nappies we ask that you supply nappies, wipes and bags and that these are replenished daily.

Safeguarding and Welfare

Medical Conditions

Please let us know as soon as possible of any medical conditions affecting your child including any food allergies or toileting needs.

Medication

You will need to complete a medical form if your child has been prescribed medicine, such as antibiotics, and they require a dose to be given during the school day. The medication should be handed into and collected from the school office along with a medical form. Please note that only prescribed medication can be given to your child in school.



If your child has an inhaler or Epipen this should be kept in school with the class teacher along with a medical form explaining the dosage.

Illness

If your child is not well enough to attend school please notify the school office on the first day of absence.

If your child becomes ill during the school day school will notify you and ask for your child to be collected. Please notify the school office immediately of any changes to your contact details.



Collecting your child at the end of the day

Nursery and Preschool finishes at 12 midday or 3pm. We would ask you to wait by the school gates and the Nursery or Preschool staff will bring your child to you at the end of the session. If you are unable to collect your child from school we will need your permission to let them go with another adult. It is useful to send a note to the class teacher to let them know of any regular arrangements or last minute changes. In an emergency please telephone the school office and they will inform the class teacher.

Accidents and Injury

If your child has had a minor accident or injured themselves at school, a note informing you of the injury and treatment will be sent home with your child and a member of the teaching team will endeavour to speak to you if necessary. If your child has an accident or injury at home we also ask that you inform the staff and complete an existing injury form in the morning.

Keeping your child safe

Hayes Meadow is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people. Parents / Carers can feel confident that careful procedures are in place to ensure that all staff and volunteers are suitable to work with children.

School hope that parents/ carers will feel free to talk about any concerns or worries which may affect the educational progress and that they will see the school as a safe place. Children will be taken seriously if they seek help from a member of staff. Parents/ Carers will normally be consulted and their consent obtained before any referral is made to an agency outside the school under local 'children in need' procedures. However, staff cannot guarantee to consult parents/ carers first, or to keep children's concerns confidential, if a referral must be made to the appropriate agencies in order to safeguard the child's welfare.

Any concerns regarding the safety or welfare of pupils should be directed to the Headteacher who is the designated person responsible for child protection or the Assistant Headteacher who is the deputy designated person.
